

Small Group Study Notes  
2 Kings 6:1-23

1. In a world where children will be crying with hunger this very evening how can it be right for us to be asking God for help to find a car parking spot?
2. Elisha has no time for the king (3:14) and yet here he is helping him. Elisha is living out Mat 5:44-45 & Rom 12:20. What is the motivation for helping those who are against us?
3. The king Joram has been protected more times than he is even aware of. And how many times have we. What do you think Jesus had in mind when he told us to pray to be delivered from (or saved from) evil (Mat 6:13)?
4. The servant fails to see reality. Reality is “those who are with us are more than those who are with them” (v16). Jesus was not unaware of this reality (Mat 26:53). In what ways is the fact that “those who are with us are more than those who are with them” meant to be understood in our everyday situations?
5. The story ends with king Joram feeding his enemies. This would not have been an easy thing for the king to do; spending money on those who had been trying to kill him. Do you have an enemy for whom you could do something nice?
